New for the 2018-19 winter season, the Epic Pass will now feature unlimited, unrestricted skiing and riding in Crested Butte and seven days in Telluride, in addition to continued unlimited, unrestricted skiing and riding at Vail, Beaver Creek, Breckenridge, Keystone, and Arapahoe Basin in Colorado and Park City in Utah. In the northeast, the Epic Pass will also now provide unlimited, unrestricted access to Okemo in Vermont and Mount Sunapee in New Hampshire, in addition to Stowe. On the west coast, the Epic Pass will now offer unlimited, unrestricted access to Stevens Pass in Washington State, in addition to continued access to Whistler Blackcomb in Canada, and Heavenly, Northstar and Kirkwood at Lake Tahoe. In the Midwest, the Epic Pass continues to offer unlimited, unrestricted access to Wilmet in Wisconsin, Afton Alps in Minnesota, and Mt. Brighton in Michigan.

Enjoy unlimited, unrestricted access to Vail, Beaver Creek, Breckenridge, Keystone, Crested Butte* and Arapahoe Basin in Colorado; Park City in Utah; Heavenly, Northstar and Kirkwood at Lake Tahoe; Stowe and Okemo* in Vermont; Mount Sunapee* in New Hampshire; Stevens Pass* in Washington; Afton Alps in Minnesota; Mt. A child pass (ages five to 12) is \$469.

Brighton or Wilmot.
