 Crested Butte Mountain Resort continues to expand terrain offerings with the seasonal openings of Spellbound and Phoenix Bowls, Staircase, Forest and Peel among other runs.
Today's terrain openings increase open skiable terrain to 1,420 total acres across 113 open trails.

The mountain operations and ski patrol teams will continue to monitor the snowpack in an effort to prepare for additional terrain openings. Skiers and riders are encouraged to stay tuned to the resort's website for snow and terrain updates: www.skicb.com/snow.

Accessing closed terrain is a violation of the Colorado Ski Safety Act and will result in the loss of skiing privileges and could involve prosecution and a fine.
