Whistler, BC – November 21, 2025 - Whistler Blackcomb officially kicked off the 2025/26 ski and ride season today, with the opening of Blackcomb Mountain, signaling the start of a winter of milestone anniversaries at North America's largest mountain resort, including Whistler Mountain's 60th season. To celebrate, the resort is officially launching Wonder Routes - a collection of seven self-guided tours designed to showcase the very best of both mountains.

The lifts fired up at 8:30 AM on Blackcomb Mountain, welcoming guests to North America's largest and most iconic ski resort. It was an energetic atmosphere, with guests treated to music, surprise giveaways, and prizes for the earliest arrivals. The mountain officially opened following a traditional welcome ceremony led by ambassadors from the Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre (SLCC) at the Base of Blackcomb Gondola in the Upper Village. The festivities continue into next week, when Whistler Mountain opens for its Diamond Anniversary season, just in time for the American Thanksgiving holiday.

"Whistler Mountain's 60th anniversary marks six decades of innovation, adventure, and rich mountain culture," said Belinda Trembath, VP & COO of Whistler Blackcomb. "From Blackcomb's 45th anniversary to 40 years of the legendary Peak to Valley Race, 45 years of Whistler Heli-Skiing, and 30 years of the World Ski and Snowboard Festival, the 2025/26 season is a tribute to everything that makes these mountains extraordinary. Whistler Blackcomb's legendary terrain will open as snowmaking and snowfall progress, eventually reaching more than 8,100 acres across two mountains, with more than 200 runs served by 36 lifts offering something for every age and skill level.
